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SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: No, they do not.

SENATOR JANSSEN: So you are saying, then, we would have those problems from the Indian casinos and then we would have to take care of them?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Exactly right.

SENATOR JANSSEN: And where would that money come from then?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Out of the state, General Fund.

SENATOR JANSSEN: I see, so, really, we are going to have all of the negatives that are associated with expanded gambling, but none of the benefits from it. We would...

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Exactly right.

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...we would get nothing from that then.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Exactly right.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Okay, so then we would still have to rehabilitate those...

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Yes.

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...prior people that...

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Yes.

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...have these problems.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: You're right.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Someone mentioned this morning that we would probably have all types of casinos in the state if we expanded the gambling. Well, I just don't think so because competition usually rules there.

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR JANSSEN: You would have...you would have casinos jump up all over probably...all depends upon what we would do. Now,
