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SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Jensen, will you yield?

SENATOR JENSEN: Okay.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Do you suppose...or support keno in Omaha?

SENATOR JENSEN: I have never been to the keno parlor.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: But do you support keno in Omaha?

SENATOR JENSEN: Personally, no.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Would you support to expand keno in Omaha?

SENATOR JENSEN: No, I would not.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: So if there would be a bill that would be to expand into lottery or video keno, you would not support that?

SENATOR JENSEN: No, I would not.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Thank you. The Attorney General has stated that if we are going to expand into any video games, whether it be keno, or whatever it is, we need to have a vote of the people. He said, we have several bills in our committee right now that deal with the expansion of keno and deal with the expansion of pickle cards, expansion of some other forms of gambling, but, basically, we can't do anything in this state for expansion of electronic and video machines without a vote of the people. So your Little League, your keno operations are all going to die in Omaha because they can't compete with what's happening over in Iowa, and if you don't care what happens to your city revenue and your Little League revenue or your VFW or Legion or whatever it is, well, then vote to bracket. But the people of this state have that right. Whether or not we give them that right, this state is still going to have some gambling. Last year we had \$660 million bet in this state legally, 600 and some million dollars spent legally in this state. Now that's a lot of gambling. What's bet in surrounding states I have no idea, I have no idea of what's bet in surrounding states. The Racing...
