So I am not going to disagree with what he says relative to the appropriateness of coming back in and ensuring that we have correct language to continue the proper fencing law on the trails in the state of Nebraska. Thank you, Madam President.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Coordsen. Senator Abboud.

SENATOR ABOUD: Madam President, I'd ask for Senator Coordsen to respond to a question.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Coordsen, will you yield?

SENATOR ABOUD: Senator Coordsen, I supported your last motion, and I plan to support this additional one to strike it. My question is getting back to the issue of the language that we're taking out. You're saying that this would...a different portion of our statutes would apply in regard to the continued maintenance of these fence lines?

SENATOR COORDSEN: That is the issue that is in disagreement between Senator Wickersham and myself. I don't know whether you were here. In a recreational trail 37-1507 provides that whenever they're developed, pursuant to the Trail Development Assistance Act, boundary fences shall be constructed and maintained. And Senator Wickersham and I have a disagreement over that application as it applies to Game and Parks Commission.

SENATOR ABOUD: Now how would you...

SENATOR COORDSEN: And he may well have a good point but, for the purposes of this morning, I think we need to take this language out. And if there is language to address Senator Wickersham's concerns, then I think that would be appropriate at the next time the bill is before us, because we're only on the 24th day of the session, and it's not an issue that's that critical to pass right at this time.

SENATOR ABOUD: What sparked part of my interest in this discussion was you discussed the issue of the attractive nuisance where there may be a pond...
