

Appropriations does that, and then we all get together and we decide whether that's the best thing to do. All my amendment is saying that if, if those costs are higher than the regular Consumer Price Index rate of growth, and that's been growing around 3 percent, if those costs are higher than that yearly, then the group who is spending all this money will recommend cost-saving measures to the Legislature, and I think that's a very intelligent thing to do other than having part-time legislators, who come in once a year and trying to make decisions for how to save money in areas that none of us are involved in, and I think it would be a very intelligent thing to do to ask them to come in and suggest ways to save money in those areas. And as to providing this other information, it is possible that we can get that. However, you know, when are we going to get it in our fiscal notes? Don't you think we should have a little more access to this without having staff and everybody go and digging for this thing? All I get in here is the Office of Juvenile Services has provided preliminary informal estimates of expansion of the program from the existing demonstration areas. Services currently provided in one or more of the demonstration areas include teacher services, community-based evaluation, proctor care, individual and family counseling, support services, case management, and a residential evaluation program and the juvenile services center. Yes, I will see if I can get all that information. However, I think when we are making decisions that involve half a million dollars, that involve potentially a billion and a half dollars, we should have maybe some of that information supplied with our fiscal notes. So I...that is something that my staff will do, to try to do that. To me, another reason a lot of this money and these programs have been going through is because we haven't seen a comprehensive approach. We only see these little incremental approaches; 988 a couple of years ago to start the pilot program. Now 1141 comes back in to expand the pilot program. Then you have also, in 988, \$10 million for a new juvenile facility. I know we needed a violent facility. I wanted a facility for violent juveniles. I approved of that area. What I did not approve of was this huge explosion and expansion in these areas that I predicted at that time would happen, that, indeed, is happening, that is continuing to happen with the process right here in the progress of this bill. And I want this Legislature to take some time to look at the comprehensive work that is being done in off...in the areas of juvenile services. My county is having major discussions on
