SENATOR WARNER: Madam President, I'll go through the bill briefly and touch on the amendment as well. This is a bill which deals with the collection of motor fuel taxes. Again, there is no substantive change. I've made the comment at the last public hearing, I hope I serve long enough or live long enough that I don't have to introduce one of these as I've been doing it for several years. But we think we...oh, I'm sorry. I'm speeding along faster than I'm supposed to. I move the, LB 1022 (sic) be advanced, which was the one dealing with the...I jumped to 1121. I move LB 1122 be advanced which was the one dealing with the tax exempt property that I already explained. Forget what I just said a little bit ago.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator... Is there any discussion of the Warner amendment to LB 1122? Senator Pirsch. Senator Pirsch.

SENATOR PIRSCH: What is the Warner amendment to LB 1122?

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Warner.
