ASSISTANT CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of Senator Warner's amendment, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Warner amendment is adopted. Senator Warner, to now open on LB 1122.

SENATOR WARNER: Madam President, members of the Legislature, I'd move that LB 1122 be advanced. I think I explained it as part of the explanation on the committee amendments which, as you recall, added the affidavit for certification. But the bill, again, will permit those who are late filing the opportunity to do so up to July 1, although the county board may assess a penalty up to 10 percent of the total tax that would have otherwise been due per month if they choose to do so, but are not required to do so. This should pretty well take care of this kind of a situation that occurs, I suspect, from county to county. So I'd move the bill be advanced.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Warner. Is there any discussion on LB 1122? Seeing none, Senator Warner to close. Closing is waived. The question before you is the advancement of LB 1122. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance the bill, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: LB 1122 advances. LB 1121.

ASSISTANT CLERK: LB 1121 was introduced by Senator Warner. (Read title.) The bill was read for the first time on January 8 of this year. Referred to the Revenue Committee. That committee reports the bill to General File with no committee amendments.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Chair recognizes Senator Warner to open on 1121.

SENATOR WARNER: Madam President, members of the Legislature, LB 1121 is, again, a number of relatively minor changes from the collection of motor fuel tax, basically came out of a group that
