PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Stuhr.

SENATOR STUHR: Yes, it is, Senator Vrtiska, it is permissive. It only allows, it doesn't require.

SENATOR VRTISKA: But, but normally the treasurer collects it. In other words what you're saying is that the village or whoever involved would have to go, would have to request that they be allowed to collect the assessment rather than county treasurer, right?

SENATOR STUHR: That's correct.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Okay.

SENATOR STUHR: It would allow them to do that.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Okay, that's all I want to know, thank you.

SENATOR STUHR: Yes.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Vrtiska. Is there any further discussion on the advancement of LB 962? Seeing none, Senator Stuhr to close. Closing is waived. The question before the body is the advancement of LB 962. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance the bill to E & R Initial.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: LB 962 advances. LB 1108.

ASSISTANT CLERK: LB 1108 was introduced by Senator Dierks. (Read title.) The bill was read for the first time on January 8 of this year, referred to the Health and Human Services Committee. The committee reports the bill to General File with no committee amendments.
