Bernard-Stevens really was just putting words in my mouth and saying we agree on this. I think it is a clarification, it makes it clear and more definite, and I support this amendment.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Bohlke. Is there any further discussion of the McKenzie amendment? Seeing none, Senator Bernard-Stevens, would you like to close? Closing is waived. The question before you is the adoption of the McKenzie amendment to LB 754. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of Senator McKenzie's amendment.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The McKenzie amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Next amendment, Senator Bernard-Stevens, I have two additional floor amendments from you, Senator. I have a note to withdraw at this time?

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Withdraw and resubmit for Select File.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: They are withdrawn.

CLERK: The next amendment I have is by Senator Chambers. Senator Chambers, I believe, is excused until he arrives.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Is anyone authorized to speak to the Chambers amendments? Is anyone authorized to speak to the Chambers amendments? We will pass over them.

CLERK: Senator Bohlke would move to amend. (Bohlke amendment, FA435, appears on page 756 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Bohlke.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Madam President, members, this essentially does what Senator Chambers was concerned about and what he raised on the floor. I had not had a chance to discuss with him, before we got to the floor this morning, if he would be here or not. So I just went ahead and filed an amendment that did essentially the same thing. This is the point he raised on the fingerprinting and it...on page 1, line 6 it inserts "his or her" and "legible", and legible is a state of art when we talk
