SENATOR WICKERSHAM: That's what I understand her bill to...

SENATOR ROBINSON: How would I...how do I know how it affects my district?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Well, Senator, you wouldn't know..

SENATOR ROBINSON: Trust me, trust me? Don't say that.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Senator, I would not suggest that you trust me because I have not statements to make that I could even characterize as a trust me proposal.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Okay. How high does your, how high does the income tax have to be before you're going to...before they're going to raise your property tax?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Well, I don't know that your property tax would be raised. It would depend on whether or not you're in a...it would probably depend on whether or not you're in an equalization district. But the definition that would be in the...there are two definitional sections in the bill that are...

SENATOR ROBINSON: Wait a minute, wait, now let's go back. You said provided it's in an equalization district. I thought you said that it depends on, it depends on how much income was in that school district.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: If you are in an equalization district and you have a high amount of income, if you have a high income equalization district...

SENATOR ROBINSON: Okay.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: It will tend to reduce your equalization aid.

SENATOR ROBINSON: By upping the amount,...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Of the local...

SENATOR ROBINSON: ...the value of your property in your district.
