SENATOR WICKERSHAM: The amount that's calculated under the local effort yield rate.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Yeah, how much does that have to be?

PRESIDENT ROBAK: One minute

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: It has to exceed...there are two definitions that are important to you, one is on page 5 of the committee amendments, and the other is on page 3 of the committee amendments. In fact, Sections 10, 11, and 12 on page 3 in Section 5 give you the formula for calculating what the effect would be.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Thank you. I'll look at that and then I'll probably be back. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Robinson. Senator Coordsen.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Madam President and members of the body. I would like to yield the first minute or two of my time to Senator Bohlke and then I'll pick up after she's done.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Bohlke.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Yes, Madam President and members, I rise in support of the reconsideration motion. I think that it allows us then to let Senator Wickersham and Senator Robak address separating off Senator Wickersham's amendment and really letting us get to Senator Robak's bill, the heart of it, and have the debate on that bill and eventually a vote. So with that in mind I do support the reconsideration motion and, Senator Coordsen, I think that was less than forty-five seconds.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you. Senator Coordsen.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Madam President and members of the body. As I shared with Senator Bohlke, it would take me three minutes to say what she said in forty-five seconds. But I, too, rise to support the reconsideration motion. I think that it's important that we keep all suggestions alive for a period of time in this body. I think that it's important that 349, in an
