

February 14, 1996 LB 908, 933

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Landis. Senator Lindsay, there are no further lights, close on the committee amendments. Closing is waived. The question is, shall the committee amendments be adopted to LB 908? All in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of committee amendments.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Lindsay, to open on the bill.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I would simply thank Senator Landis for laying the, thirteen years ago laying the groundwork for me, knowing that I would be here in 1996 to try to move this important legislation through and Senator Landis going through the fight, taking the blows for me. I appreciate that, Senator Landis. And I would urge you and the rest of the members to vote to advance the bill.

CLERK: LB 933, introduced by Senator Cudaback. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 3, referred to General Affairs, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill, Mr. President.
