PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Landis. Senator Maurstad.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: Thank you, Madam President. Senator Landis, I just want to clarify, for the record, because I know that in many times in circumstances like this it's misunderstood in that what we're talking about here is only the bodily injury that's involved and not protection for the vehicle itself or any physical damage coverage (interruption)...

SENATOR LANDIS: That's right. If you'll remember the hypothetical, I said if you were personally injured, that's what we're talking about here.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: Yeah, you articulated it very well, but I just think we need to emphasize that so that there isn't any misunderstanding with the members or the public relative to what this bill will do. And I stand up to support it. Thank you, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Maurstad. Any further discussion of the committee amendments? Seeing none, Senator Landis waives closing. The question before you is the adoption of the committee amendments to LB 1008. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of committee amendments.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Committee amendments are adopted. Senator Landis, to open on the bill.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you, Madam President. I hope I've explained the bill. I do think it's balanced in that it expands appropriate recovery, but it has limitations to attack any potential fraud use and for that reason I'd urge the advancement of 1008.
