SENATOR JANSSEN: ...or the income tax doesn't necessarily mean that this would come out of the whole equalization pool. It would only be from the eighty some million dollars that is in there for the nonequalized districts, right? I'm sure that's right.

SENATOR BOHLKE: It comes out of that 83 million,...

SENATOR JANSSEN: So it isn't coming out of the rest of the income tax equalization aid.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Right. But, Senator Janssen, that 83 million goes out to all school districts, the 83 does. But the difference between the 83 and what's been there in income tax rebate is going over into the equalization.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Into the equalization...

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...so actually that does not bother that portion.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Correct.

SENATOR JANSSEN: I had a question asked of me yesterday and I said,...
