PRESIDENT ROBAK: Time.

SENATOR STUHR: ...support Senator Wickersham's amendment. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Stuhr. Senator Beutler.

CLERK: 10 ayes, 11 nays to cease debate, Madam President.

CLERK: Madam President, a priority motion. Senator Robak would move to bracket LB 1050 until February 14, 1997.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Chair recognizes Senator Robak to open on her bracket motion.
