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necessary. We probably shouldn't have to follow our goals in what we wanted to do. But I think in working for harmony statewide, and making people a little more comfortable with the change, that it was a good thing to do because we are one state, after all, and we do have to work together and that's how the process works. So I would hope that we would then just vote this section forward. We'd have not much debate on this section any more. We move on to the others and then we can still discuss the bill as its entirety after the committee amendments are adopted. So my hope is that we can move very quickly. Those that want to discuss the issue, after we get through the next two subsections of the committee amendment, we can then have a full out discussion on the entire process, and that's when people will have their opportunity. So I urge that we move and vote on this second section of the division of the committee amendments.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Senator Bernaid-Stevens. Next speaker, Senator Schrock.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I'm ready to move forward to this issue. I'm not sure how the printout's going to look when I get it for my districts, but I have some districts that look quite wealthy because of a lot of irrigated crop land. And I have some districts that look rather poor because of a lot of pasture land and lot of poor dry land type of agriculture. But I know I have a lot of districts with a lot of poor income. And the compromise from the urban side is that they're willing to put some income tax money into this equalization formula, and I think it's the first time we've done that, if I'm not correct. And so I'm ready to move this forward one round. I commend Senator Bohlke and the Education Committee. Maybe not everybody's going to like what's going to happen, but I think it's time to move this portion forward so we can have time to discuss the other portions. And there's always Select File. With that, I conclude my remarks.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Senator Schrock. Senator Robinson. Senator Robinson waives off. Senator Abboud.

SENATOR ABOUD: Thank you, Mr. President. I had some questions for Senator Bohlke.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Senator Bohlke, would you respond to a
