SENATOR CUDABACK: Madam President and members, many times we, as senators, representing our districts don't always have the time and expertise to go into every subject, but we all have our public hearings, we're on this particular committee and that committee. But I do respect the Education Committee for dealing with this problem. This one part of the puzzle that absolutely needed adjustments for a long time. So I do appreciate them looking at this part of the puzzle and addressing it. I'd like to ask Senator Bohlke one question please.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Bohlke.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Yes.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Bohlke, am I right in saying that this won't necessarily bring us up to the actual cost. It will still be a factor.

SENATOR BOHLKE: This keeps us somewhat below average, Senator Cudaback. We would have had to gone to 475 percent times the mileage rate to get us at that midpoint.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Will there be some schools that still are above, actually receive more than actual costs, or...?

SENATOR BOHLKE: No.

SENATOR CUDABACK: No. So we'll all just be a little bit below what our actual cost could be.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Either equal or...but a majority of them will be below.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Yeah. And this will not bring any money into the nonequalized districts, no money.

SENATOR BOHLKE: It does not affect the nonequalized districts.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Nonequalized, no...

SENATOR BOHLKE: Right.

SENATOR CUDABACK: They're out, yeah.
