SENATOR BOHLKE: Senator Robinson.

SENATOR ROBINSON: ...support that type of expenditure?

SENATOR BOHLKE: Senator Robinson, currently, when we discuss at-risk students and that school districts may qualify for help with a number of at-risk students, I certainly think that these students, in the bill that I introduced with the one tier, that happens to be a weighting factor, and I would certainly think those students would qualify.

SENATOR ROBINSON: So you are telling me you would support some expenditures.

SENATOR BOHLKE: That's what I'm saying,...

SENATOR BOHLKE: ...and I'm saying that that discussion and certainly the one tier would recognize that.
