implementation date on some of this ought to be changed, because we are talking about an implementation date that will affect the next, this coming budget year, this coming budget year, and when you combine, if you're a nonequalization district, and you combine the effects of the income tax rebate changes, the insurance tax, if they're affected by that, and whatever else, whatever else is affected by 1050, I suspect we'll have some districts that will be significantly impacted, and I am not sure that I want to do that. If we...if we could...if we could do that at such time as we bring about some other property tax relief, it would sure be a lot more palatable for these districts if we could coordinate that somehow. And we have all these...we have these other bills on property tax effects coming through this body, as well as this bill, so it seems to me it behooves us to try to coordinate that a little bit and not just look at changes in 1059, in this bill, and forget about that when we go to the property tax relief bills. So as we approach Select File, I hope that we can have some people looking at the timing of these changes and looking at the possibility of maybe stair-stepping in or phasing in some of the changes that may come about here. And this bill does have the emergency clause attached. It will become effective upon signing of it by the Governor, and so I think...I think we need to look at that by the time we get to Select File. Thank you.
