SENATOR CROSBY: Time.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Bohlke. You've heard the closing. The question is the advancement of LB 1050 to E & R Initial. All in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 2 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of LB 1050.

SENATOR CROSBY: The bill is advanced. Do you have anything, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: I do, Madam President, thank you. Amendments to be printed to LB 1050 by Senator Maurstad. Education Committee reports LB 1145 as indefinitely postponed.
