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original green copy of the bill or the committee amendment requires these appraisals to be done before December 1 of '96. That is...that is not...not the intent and not the case. The appraisals would be relevant in a time frame that would be close to the sale of the land, so that they are sure they get a fair price for the sale when it occurs, and I would also point out this is envisioned to take place over 15 years, so appraisals occurring...appraisals occurring in '96 would not be necessarily relevant to the sales of parcels of land five years down the road or ten years down the road or twelve years down the road. All we are asking, by December 1 of '96 in the committee amendment, is that the Board of Educational Lands and Funds prepare a plan for the sale and submit that to the Education Committee by December 1 of '96. We're asking that the plan comply with the fiduciary duties of the board, which we...they have stressed, they have fiduciary duties, we understand that, the courts have recognized that, the constitution recognizes that. But by the same token, we are saying let's provide a reasonable plan in compliance with the fiduciary duties by December 1 of '96. If they come in December 1, '96 and say, this is our tentative plan, but we need an additional six months or a year on this aspect or these details, we can certainly address that in the '97 Legislature. But I think after all these years, and where we are at now with the property tax situation, and other issues will be addressed as we debate this bill, I don't see a compelling reason to give them an extra...to drop these dates back...

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR BROMM: ...a year. I just don't...don't see it. So I'm more...I am more interested in the principles that we are dealing with here, and we have to compromise on a date here and there, that's not a big deal to me. But I think let's move ahead with the dates proposed by the committee, see how it goes, and make adjustments next year in '97 in our session, if we need to. Thank you, Madam Chairman.

SENATOR CROSBY. Thank you, Senator Bromm. Senator Withem.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Yes, I have a question for Senator Bohlke, if she would get a minute or two to respond to it. Senator Bohlke, I have a concern...
