SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Bernard-Stevens. Senator Jones.

SENATOR JONES: Madam President and members of the body, I want to stand and support the bill. I can give you a lot of examples, but I think the one good example would be in Cherry County alone, my son lives 150 miles from the county seat and they have to deliver the ballots out there ahead of time, and they have to send somebody out to pick them up afterwards, and there's only 24 registered voters in that whole precinct. So you're going to save a lot of money on anything that's special election, if the county chooses to do so. So I think in the rural area and places like that it's really going to be an advantage. And hopefully we can do it. I realize they still got to do it for primary and general, but this is just for a special election. So I think this is a good deal. Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Jones. Senator Witek.

SENATOR WITEK: Thank you very much. I just wanted to have on the record that, although I still have grave reservations about advancing this bill because it now includes the entire state, it does have a supermajority vote of the governing body, which is, I think, an excellent change to the bill. But I don't know about the rest of the senators. When I work with the lists and the labels from my county commissioner, my election commissioner and their office, and it's supposed to be registered voters, I mean it is a mess. (Laugh.) It's like half and half. Half the people don't live where they are anymore, half the people don't even live in the district anymore. So if we're going to mail out to the registered voters in my district, using those lists I would assume, a lot of these ballots are going to be going to people who no longer live there. And I just think that in...especially in a county the size of Douglas County, I hope that the governing bodies will be very careful about doing something like this. I was willing to do it in a smaller area, kind of a test area, maybe have some advance on how it would work and maybe getting the list in a little better shape.
