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Legislature, at least when it enacts a law, is presumed to know all of the law that currently exists on that particular subject and enacted the law in question with those laws that currently are in place in mind. So if there are activities that a whole family is engaged in, the assumption is that the legislators know everything that all the members of that family are doing and approves. Since I'm not in a position to do that, I will not vote for the package of resolutions, I will not vote against them. But despite the fact that they basically are worthless, I think when a resolution...

SENATOR COORDSEN: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...is to be voted on by the Legislature, perhaps we should massage some of them to say no more than that which we're willing to back up. So, I'm not going to ask various members of the Legislature about the business activities and practices of living members of a whole family. But I'm sure that there are things with which I would disagree. And such being the case, I'm not going to vote for these resolutions.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Engel.

SENATOR ENGEL: Mr. Chairman, members of the body, I would like to just make a few, quick comments about Dan Gardner, Mr. Dan Gardner, who Senator Chambers mentioned he was in the egg business, and he was, retired now. I'm not going to elaborate on everything that's in the Journal, but I do want to mention just a few words about Dan Gardner. He's a very unassuming man who has accomplished a great deal in his lifetime. And his wife, Jeanne, and he have shared this success with so many people in northeast Nebraska, in the community of Wakefield, the community of Wayne, and especially Wayne State College. So I would highly recommend that you certainly honor this person today. Thank you.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Senator Engel. There are no other lights. Senator...Senator Chambers waives off. Senator Withem, did you wish to close?

SPEAKER WITHEM: Yeah, I would make a couple of points. First of all, Senator Chambers, I would point out that the Legislature is not endorsing activities of these people, we are...the operative language over here, "the Legislature extends its
