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rather than with, again, the Board of Educational Lands and Funds?

SENATOR BROMM: Well, they're initially deposited with the State Treasurer, and the State Treasurer, as I understand it, is then instructed to deposit that money with the Nebraska Investment Council, who manages it. But it starts, all of those funds start out, initially, running through the State Treasurer's hands.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay.

SENATOR BROMM: And I think that's just simply statutory.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay, thank you.

SENATOR WILL: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Senator Beutler, on the Bromm amendment.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Question.

SENATOR WILL: Senator Beutler, there's been only one speaker. I think at this point I would rule that out of order. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I don't want to say Senator Beutler saw my light on, but I do have a question or two I want to ask of Senator Bromm. Senator Bromm,...

SENATOR WILL: Senator Bromm, would you yield?

SENATOR BROMM: Certainly.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I understand that with the adoption of the committee amendment that we're talking now about a report to be compiled, but it can begin to be implemented, if the Legislature doesn't do anything to modify it or overturn it next session? Is that correct, as far as I went?

SENATOR BROMM: The committee amendment says that the plan would be implemented beginning July 1 of '97, yes, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, now would that plan be allowed to
