SENATOR WILL: Time. Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Bromm.

SENATOR BROMM: Question.

SENATOR WILL: The question has been called. Do I see five hands? I do, and the question is, shall debate cease? All those in favor vote yes, opposed no. Mr. Clerk, please record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, to cease debate.

SENATOR WILL: Debate has ceased. Senator Bromm to close on the advancement of LB 1205.

SENATOR BROMM: I will waive closing.

SENATOR WILL: Senator Bromm waives. The question before the body is the advancement of LB 1205 to E & R Initial. All those in favor vote yes, opposed no. A record vote has been requested. Have you all voted? Mr. Clerk, please record.

CLERK: (Read record vote. See pages 861-62 of the Legislative Journal.) 36 ayes, 6 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 1205.

SENATOR WILL: LB 1205 advances. Now, as per the agenda, we will move to the motion to suspend rules to permit the introduction of the claims bills. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Abboud, pursuant to Rule 5, Section 4, would move for the introduction of new bills, LB 21...or Request 2110 and 2109.

SENATOR WILL: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Senator Abboud.

SENATOR ABOUD: Mr. President, members, today I'm requesting on behalf of the Business and Labor Committee the introduction of the 1996 claims bills. It requires a three-fifths vote. These claims that are going to be presented before the Legislature are, after the 60-day appeal period in which they've either been denied or have been accepted as far as with the claims against the state of Nebraska, and the end of the 60 days occurred on January 26 of this year.
