SENATOR COORDSEN: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Mr. President, members of the Legislature, before I tell you what the amendment does. because it's very brief, I'd like to ask Senator Witek a question or two, if I can, to understand what she's doing, if she can make me understand, if she can help me to understand. Senator Witek, did you draft your amendment yourself, or did somebody else draft it? Excuse me, could they turn Senator Witek on so I could hear her.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Senator Witek.

SENATOR WITEK: I'm sorry, I'm usually on the other mike, that's probably why I'm not turned on. No, my legislative aide drafted it, this morning, after your objections to the name of the act, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, Senator Witek, did your aide tell you that there are other places in the bill where this name is mentioned? Did he tell you that?

SENATOR WITEK: Your objections this morning were specifically, if I can remember, if we're going to call this...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That's not what I'm asking. I'm...

SENATOR WITEK: ...the Sex Offender Registration Act,...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I want to understand your amendment the way it's drafted.

SENATOR WITEK: I'm just changing the name of the...of the act.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Then let me ask you more directly, why didn't you change it in other places of the bill where the name of the act is given? I'd just like to know.

SENATOR WITEK: Well, if that's what...if that's what your amendment does, Senator, I appreciate...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, I'm just asking you.
