CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Abboud's amendment.

SENATOR COORDSEN: The amendment is adopted. Any other items, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: I have nothing further on this bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Okay, that would...to the bill, Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Abboud, I just wanted to get some clarifications on the record here with regard to a particular procedure that's envisioned by the bill. And I'm referencing, on the E & R copy, what is page 7, lines 1 through 7, if you could turn there.

SENATOR ABOUD: Sure. I'm sorry, what page was that again, Senator Beutler?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Page 7, on the E & R copy. Is your copy marked like mine, into pages on the side? If it's not, it's page 717, the first lines 1 through 7 at the top.

SENATOR ABOUD: Okay, I got a copy of it. Page 7, what?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Lines 1 through 7.

SENATOR ABOUD: Okay.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, there's a procedure outlined there, or there's a requirement there, I should say, where "the sheriff of each county shall cause written notification of the duty to register to be provided to any person who enters the state from another jurisdiction and makes application for a motor vehicle operator's license." Let me just ask you, first off, if the...if a person does apply for a motor vehicles...motor vehicle operator's license, and the sheriff fails to notify them that they need to put their name on the register to comply, are they...are they subject to prosecution under the criminal provision for failure to register in the event that that notice is not given to them by the sheriff? I mean I guess it's a question of your intent. If the sheriff is required to give
