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do they get that information?

SENATOR COORDSEN: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Is each sheriff going to be obliged to go where and review what records and how often in order to get this information?

SENATOR ABOUD: Yeah, Senator Beutler, it would be the duty of the sheriff to submit it to the State Patrol. So they would have a duty, each sheriff of each county would have a duty, which I assume, since this bill is in their interest in locating these types of individuals, that they would want to comply with the law. But the duty would be upon the sheriff to notify the State Patrol in the manner that they see fit. Is that...does that answer your question?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Maybe, or maybe I misunderstand the provision. This is...I assume that somebody is doing some kind of scan of the criminal records and then comparing that to those who apply for drivers' licenses. Is that...

SENATOR COORDSEN: Time.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...what's happening?

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, Mr. Speaker and members. I guess I would like to ask Senator Abboud a question, first of all.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Senator Abboud, would you respond to a question, please.

SENATOR ABOUD: Yes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Senator Abboud, I just wanted to get clear on the A bill on this, do you have any comments? I have some costs here that I want to bring out to the body, if you're going to put the A bill in, or whether I should exp...I just want the body aware of potential costs on this, even though they're not that great. I feel obligated to call them to attention. Do you want to dis...will there be an A bill, or should I talk about it
