SENATOR ABOUD: Yes, by notification through the county clerk.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: Okay, so he could provide them with a pad of these, and every time someone comes in from out of state, just take off the deal, give it to them and they would need to sign it and give it back, and that would go to the sheriff, and that would comply with the act.

SENATOR ABOUD: Yes, it would, Senator Maurstad.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: Thank you.

SENATOR ABOUD: Thank you for the question.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Senator Maurstad. Senator Vrtiska.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Thank you, Senator Coordsen. I just wanted to ask a question of Senator Abboud, since...

SENATOR COORDSEN: Senator Abboud, a question, please.

SENATOR VRTISKA: The discussion came up with Senator Wehrbein regarding the fiscal note. And I was just curious, since it appears that this legislation is somewhat in line with the federal requirements, is there any...will there be any federal dollars that will be available for the implementation under this type of legislation, or is this strictly a state issue?

SENATOR ABOUD: The money that would possibly be used would be coming through the Crime Commission. This federal funding issue is strictly an issue that deals with money that goes to our State Crime Commission. So I guess that would be up to the...our Crime Commission as to how much of that money they would use for this particular program, how much of the money would be going to the State Patrol.

SENATOR VRTISKA: In other words, if the...the money would go to the Crime Commission, if they decided they wanted to utilize some of that funds to offset some of the cost, they could do it, that's up to them.

SENATOR ABOUD: That's right.
