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why I took it as a priority, I see significance in what it can do for Nebraska and in terms of our efforts to streamline operations and streamline government processes is there. Sarpy County has always been a leader, I think, in the one-stop shop which...operations, in terms of Department of Motor Vehicles licensure. This bill does that for the trucking industry, and I strongly support that process and that philosophy. My portion, or the other legislation that relates to this was the addition of LB 1288 into that legislation. What this is, is a year ago or so LB 424, which is a piece of legislation that took over because of some deregulation in terms at the federal level, the Household Good Movers Division of the Nebraska Motor Carriers Association opposed, originally opposed and resisted expanding. After a year in process and looking at what regulations we have, they have come back and said, we will accept that, we think we need regulation. And partly the reason for that is that you need to protect the people. In household good movers you have a situation where an individual only moves once or twice in their lifetime. With that, they aren't sophisticated, they don't know what questions to ask and that, so that is why to include some protection for those. We find situations where carriers are operating without insurance, they're not adhering or don't have any type of freight claim policies, and it's a little regard for safety. So under those circumstances, there is a need out there to make sure that the people that are getting moved are protected. To further explain that I think the situation is that in Omaha, for instance, if you're moving from somewhere in Omaha to Papillion there is no regulation, and there is no guarantee. The citizen can be taken advantage of. But if you move from say Omaha to Gretna, under the circumstances, there is protection. And we feel that...and what this bill does is provide that protection throughout, anybody that moves. So this is one of the first times that people are saying, yes, we do want some regulation. With that, I will ask for your support in this and also offer to try to answer any questions, if you have any. Thank you.
