I guess, in looking at his...or listening to his explanation, it certainly does tighten down the bill. As I indicated the other day when we were debating this bill, I would like to make this as narrow as I possibly can and still be able to provide what I'm trying to do, and I think this, in fact, does that and so I wish to thank Senator Chambers for bringing this amendment up and would encourage you to support it, so that we can move on with the rest of the bill. Thank you.
