SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: The other thing I wanted to ask about, if there's time, has to do with the type of weapon that you're tested with. Is...do you need to say anything about the fact that if you're planning to carry one type of weapon concealed that you should be tested with that weapon?

SENATOR SCHMITT: The concealed...the concealed part has been taken out of this, Senator Beutler, with the committee amendment.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Well, it doesn't...I'm sorry, it doesn't have to be concealed. If you carry a particular type of weapon, if your standard sidearm, as a patrolman, is a particular type of weapon, shouldn't you have to be tested with that type of weapon?

SENATOR SCHMITT: Right, and under department policies, as far as I know, different cities or towns may allow their officers to carry different types of weapons. In fact, the patrol allows them to carry two or three different calibers,...

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Time.

SENATOR SCHMITT: ...and so they would have to be qualified with that particular weapon. Yeah, that's set up by policy.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Is there any further discussion on the committee amendments to LB 1055? Seeing none, Senator Lindsay to close. Is anyone prepared to close on the committee amendments? Seeing not, the question before the body is the adoption of the committee amendments to LB 1055. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Senator Schmitt.

SENATOR SCHMITT: Ask for a call of the house. I'll accept call-in votes.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator, there's no need.
