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amendment, because this amendment I'm going to support and I won't delay his adoption of that.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: I just had my light on to open (inaudible).

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Lindsay.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Madam President. I'm going to speak for just a second here, and then as soon as Senator Kristensen catches his breath, allow him...he's here now and he can follow up if he wants any of this time. Following up on what Senator Chambers indicated, that as far as people forming partnership, an LLP and a corporation can do that, can do that now. The pur...although the reasons would not be there as much as they are under current law. Under current law you would form...you might form a separate corporation because there is no possibility of limiting your liability in a general partnership. Under the L...with an LLP, the extent of that, the ability to shield from your partners' negligence, and that is the primary thrust of the LLP law is shielding you from what your partner might do rather than what you're doing. So I think it's following up to continue what...that answer to Senator Chambers' question, that's what I would do. With that, Madam President, I would yield the balance of time to Senator Kristensen, if he would like it.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Kristensen, there's four minutes remaining.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Senator Lindsay and members of the Legislature. I appreciate Senator Landis beginning the discussion to allow me the time to get here. Senator Chambers, I was just hearing your conversation as I walked in the door, so I'm not going to take up my full time just to mark time, but I'd be happy to answer your questions. While there's others...I see there's other lights on this issue, let's let them discuss that and I'll come over and see if there's specific things we can do. With that, I'd yield the rest of my time back, thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Kristensen. Senator Lindsay, anything further? Senator Jones, your light is next.
