

SENATOR LYNCH: ...city-county government. Okay.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Lynch. Senator Maurstad, followed by Robinson, Hartnett, Engel, Jones, Bernard-Stevens, Cudaback, Wehrbein, Kristensen, and Wickersham.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: I'll waive off.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Maurstad, you're waiving off. Senator Robinson.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Madam President and members of the body, we heard this bill (sic) in Government Committee and we had...we used the video to go around the state. And as I look at it, I think it's an alternative for county government to use. I see nothing wrong with what the bill (sic) does. I compare it...as you compare it to city government, basically most cities have a, either the clerk in the small town runs the administration of the city and then in the larger, in the Class, I think it's Class I cities, I know like Blair, we have a city administrator. And I think it's, I think that person really keeps his eye on all the segments that go around on city government. I don't think that happens in county government. I think you have about, how many heads of agencies, or different offices, I think they have their own little fiefdom. And I think it would work well. And I guess I would question whether if you had administrative form of government, I'm not sure you would need the supervisory form of government we have in counties. But that's another subject for another time. But I would certainly, I certainly support LR 46CA. Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Robinson. Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Madam President and members of the body, Senator Hillman, a question. I'm looking at the last page of your handout, Roger Wehrbein read it before, and Sarpy County, what's going to be different with this type of government, what you're proposing, than what we do right now in Sarpy County, I think as Senator Lynch talked about in Douglas County, I think Lancaster? We have a, kind of an administrator type right now that...is that just by the size?
