But usually something prompts action like this, whether it's the people within the county or another motive to drive a situation where there's a major change. Now Buffalo County, where I come from, Dawson County, whatever, those counties seem to be operating quite nicely currently. I can't speak for all counties, but like I say, usually something prompts a move like this here. I've always been for a vote of the people on a major change. I did this on the alcohol and I did this on the gambling issue. And I've always been for a situation where there's a major, major change that people probably should decide that rather than 25 yes votes. And so it's tough for me to vote for an issue like this. I would like to ask Senator Hillman a question, please, if she would allow me to.
