

is that explanation. Now many times, which a county clerk does, this goes on and tells a little bit more about it and, you know, and how it would happen. But like, I guess, how well the people would know, that's the same as it is with any issue that's out there, and I am assuming this year they're going to have several constitutional amendments to address. And so, yes, it's going to be who, I think, in my opinion anyway, the voter to know what all those constitutional amendments mean.

SENATOR CUDABACK: I guess it would be subject to an amendment, that wording. I did read that wording, but I'm still not sure that the people in Nebraska would understand, you know, exactly what, thinking they were maybe voting for more efficiency, more of this, more of that, but when it come right down to it, and I appreciated the question of Senator Kristensen when he said how would the...would they be voting on one czar, so to speak, or one dictator, not dictator, that's the wrong word to use, but I mean a, one person to run the entire county rather than what we currently have.

SENATOR HILLMAN: Okay, I guess, again I would go back to do you see the city of Kearney or the city of North Platte having, with a county administrator or a county manager, a czar dictating what happens in a city?

SENATOR CUDABACK: I guess that form of government's what's the choice of people, like I said earlier. And I do respect the rights of people to choose their own destiny. But we did set this out years and years ago when we started this great Nebraska, that the county governments, we decided how we function then, so we're going to make this major change. And I just wonder if the people, you know, back to the original question, would the people know what they were voting on when they did vote on this change. I guess that's what bothers me more than anything else.

SENATOR HILLMAN: Senator Cudaback, they will know as much as they want to know about this particular issue, as they will any other issue.

SPEAKER WITHEM: One minute.

SENATOR HILLMAN: And, again, I would go back to, there was a time when there also wasn't a city administrative form of
