SENATOR HILLMAN: Senator Kristensen, I've not discussed this with you before, so I probably have some questions as to what the bracket motion would do and when. I probably would like to see it advance to Select File. It might not go any further than that, but I hate to see it completely out of the picture. But if we could advance it today, and then you could look at...we could look at scheduling, we could look at perhaps a bracket on Select File to see where you're going and if there are any parts of this then that would fit in with what you're doing. But at this point I would rather see it advance to Select File. And I'm very willing to work with you on this to see where the total picture will go, because my whole point and my whole focus here is to be able to allow county government, as I've said many times, to be able to be a little more control, that people on a local level are a little more in control of their destiny and how they're being governed on a local level in the area especially of personal property tax and some of those other things. At this point I think the state of Nebraska stands in their way with a lot of things that could perhaps be improvements. So I guess my preference would be if we could advance it to Select File and look then, and I don't plan to amend it in or anything. But then look at where you're going, just leave it in scheduling at the bottom of the list, but would get it advanced to Select File.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: I...if that occurs, would it be your preference then to have the Revenue Committee's bill be debated first and taken up on Select File first, prior to this one?

SENATOR HILLMAN: I don't have any problems with that.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Okay. And I appreciate that, and I don't think there's anybody here who's questioned your sincerity about willing to work and do things. But this is a huge philosophic change, and there are certainly some things in here that we need to be careful of. I'm very concerned about what the definitions and the words "county administrator form" is. I don't know, constitutionally, what that means. I'm worried about counties getting into something that they can't get themselves out of, and I'm also a little worried about...
