things, one is there is a term, this is if you remember correctly, deals in the area of titling motor boats where we've used the term "designated county official" as drafted, we put that term in there. However, if there are counties who have not done some of the consolidation or things that we envisioned with a designated county official in the area of titling, there was some confusion for those counties who had not done it, who is the designated county official. So a county board did not have to go about taking the extra step of designating the appropriate official, we've put this language in here so there's...and certainly removed by stating throughout the act, where appropriate the county clerk or designated official or county treasurer or designated county official. It'll just make it easier for the county officials throughout the county depending...or the counties across the state to comply with the act and not cause them any uncertainty. The final is new Section 15, which is basically an internal reference statute which changes no substance, but does make the bill internally correct. And with that I would be happy to answer any questions and would urge the adoption of this amendment.
