SENATOR WESELY: Senator Dierks, can you...what is the ultimate impact of this amendment, I guess I .

SENATOR DIERKS: This is a bill that was suggested by...or this was an amendment that was suggested by Bill Drafting, Senator Wesely,...

SENATOR WESELY: Oh.

SENATOR DIERKS: ...that it certifies...it says that certificates won't expire as soon as the bill is effective.

SENATOR WESELY: Oh, okay.

SENATOR DIERKS: And the A bill, we've introduced an A bill, I should tell you too, that has been changed from about \$10,000 to \$7,800 I believe.

SENATOR WESELY: Okay, I've looked at it. It's fine. Thank you very much. I stand in support of the amendment. Thank you.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Senator Wesely. Senator Engel. I'm sorry, I'm sorry, Senator Engel, we didn't hear you, would you like to repeat your statement.

SENATOR ENGEL: I'd like to speak at the next amendment, with the next amendment.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Senator Engel. There are no further lights on. Senator Dierks, did you wish to close? Closing is waived. The issue before the body is the adoption of the Dierks amendment to LB 1108. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.
