SENATOR MATZKE: Well, I assume either within that or very soon thereafter. There isn't any limitation in the wording there. But my understanding, from the testimony at the hearing, is that, that this is a practice that is done by some doctors and pharmacists to fill a partial prescription on a trial basis, if that's what the doctor and the patient want.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. So if it's not...if the notice is not given during the 72-hour period would you, would it be your intent that it be given within the 24-hour period following the 72-hour period?

SENATOR MATZKE: Yes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, thank you, Senator Matzke.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you. There are no further lights on. Did you wish to close on your amendment, Senator Matzke?

SENATOR MATZKE: I would just urge the members of the Legislature to adopt this amendment please.

SENATOR COORDSEN: You've heard the closing. The issue before the body is the adoption of the Matzke amendment to LB 1108. Those in favor please vote aye, those opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Matzke's amendment.

SENATOR COORDSEN: The Matzke amendment is adopted. Anything further on the bill?

CLERK: Nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Senator Maurstad.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: Mr. President, I'd move to advance LB 1108 to E & R for engrossing.

SENATOR COORDSEN: You've heard the motion to advance 1108 to E & R for engrossment. All those in favor say aye. Opposed nay. The bill is advanced. Next item, Mr. Clerk.
