SENATOR CUDABACK: Is there any language that states who...who might actually serve on this fifteen member advisory board?

SENATOR WESELY: Well, there are two entities, the task force that we've talked about is, and I want to follow up on your point about too many commissions and task forces. This task force, to look at the codes, goes out of existence when they do their report in December, so it will not be around this time next year.

SENATOR CUDABACK: That's good.

SENATOR WESELY: And there are nine members on that currently. There's an amendment by Senator Withem that will address that question of how many and who they'll come from, but right now it doesn't specify. The other commission that is established to advise the trust fund, actually the wording we have in there says, look to using existing commission, because we have a number already. We don't want to create a new one. We'll take one of the existing ones or a subgroup of that and that way we don't have to have a duplicative situation. And so that fifteen member one will end up being one of the existing ones and not create something new, we think, in the end.

SENATOR CUDABACK: So it will...actually the commission will go away in a year's time or whatever.

SENATOR WESELY: The task force will.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Task force.

SENATOR WESELY: The other commission is probably going to be one that already exists and we won't create a new one.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Okay, good. Now the trust fund, the trust fund itself, is that going to...an ongoing...

SENATOR WESELY: The trust fund will be ongoing, yes it will.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Trust fund is ongoing.

SENATOR WESELY: Um-hum.
