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is making sure that you are ready for the growth that might occur, the infrastructure is in place, or the ability to put the infrastructure in place, so that you can have orderly growth. But this being the top concern of these...of these efforts in the area of economic development is certainly a new one to me because I thought the Governor's initiative was to attract quality workers to our state. We can only have one top concern. I would submit to you that low...providing affordable low-income housing is not a top priority to the state of Nebraska. My amendment, just to refresh everybody's memory, is to delete the possibility that the Legislature would provide an appropriation for this trust fund, and I would ask...I would ask the members to support the amendment

SENATOR BERNARD-STLVENS: Thank you, Senator Maurstad. Senator Hartnett, on the Maurstad amendment.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Mr. President, members of the body, I want to, as we normally do, I am going to talk about general things here. Senator Wesely or Senator Schimek, the amendment that we had before, maybe we should have talked to it...it says it is going to look at state and local statutes, regulation and codes, planning and zoning process, and so forth, land, and licensing and inspection requirements for state and local governments. Will this task force make some recommendation, because what I hear sometimes from some of my...and we're in a area of the community where...or an area of the state, community, area of the state where there is a lot of building activity, and sometimes it seems to be that that, you know, cities are using...setting up more and more barriers, or bridges that builders have to go over to get to build housing, whether this type of housing or not, because if you're talking about low-in...this type of housing, it causes some barr...are they going to come up with some kind of a state type of recommended models, standards for...for cities to look at? And the cost of fees, that there is somewhat, you know, kind of a range of fees and so forth. And I...you know I'm...you had a very impressive look of people...I am looking at proponents of the bill, you know, League of Municipalities and so forth. And a few years ago, we had...I think, we finally got a...Senator McKenzie finally got dealing with manufactured housing that they fought tooth and nail because it did away with their zoning and so forth. So my question is a general question, you know, what is this task force going to do? Is it going to give some
