All these commission members should not be from Grand Island, Scottsbluff, Kearney, or whatever. They should be from across the state of Nebraska, and I simply think it's a good addition to the bill to make it more complete, so I'd just urge your support for this amendment to 1322. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. Senator Wesely. Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you, Madam President, members of the body. I rise in support of the Cudaback amendment, at least in favor of the concept of the Cudaback amendment. I don't know if it should be worded any more specifically than that, Senator, but I think that the concept is good. So I would just encourage your support. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator. Senator Cudaback. Is there any further discussion of the Cudaback amendment? Seeing none, Senator Cudaback to close. Closing is waived. The question before you is the adoption of the Cudaback amendment to LB 1322. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the adoption of Senator Cudaback's amendment.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Cudaback amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Senator Beutler would move to amend with AM3453. (See page 1008 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Chair recognizes Senator Beutler to open on his amendment.

SENATOR BEUTLER. Lieutenant Governor Robak, members of the Legislature, this amendment has been passed out to you. It is AM3453, and it, basically, establishes a couple of definitions. The definitions are of affordable housing and of what low income means and, as you know, there are no definitions in the bill currently, and, therefore, no restrictions on the kinds of programs or the economic groups to which this, essentially a
