SENATOR CROSBY: Are we still working at that, Don?

SENATOR WESELY: They're working on different teams, they're starting to put those together, Senator Crosby,...

SENATOR CROSBY: Um-huh, okay.

SENATOR WESELY: ...and they will include front-line employees.

SENATOR CROSBY: Okay. And right now, I mean there are slots there that the Governor could come along and name someone to? I'm just...I'm sort of confused here with this particular issue.
