

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Senator Wesely. There are no other lights on. Did you wish to close, Senator Beutler? Closing is waived. The issue before the body is the Beutler amendment to LB 1044. Those in favor please vote aye, those opposed nay. We're voting on the Beutler amendment to LB 1044. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Beutler's amendment.

SENATOR COORDSEN: The Beutler amendment is adopted. Next item, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Senator Beutler, you have the next several amendment. Full...pull all of them, Senator. Mr. President, the next amendment I believe I have to the bill is by Senator Chambers. (See FA486 found on page 1038 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR COORDSEN: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I have an attitude about this bill. A copy of this amendment is being brought to you. I just had my glasses and somebody must have sneaked over here and taken them, but I have a lot of help in looking for them. But, anyway, I can tell you what this amendment would do. Oh, under my foot but I didn't quite step on them. Thank you. This amendment would say everywhere in this bill where you find the term "Policy Secretary" you'd strike, and you'd insert "Feuhrer." Wherever the word "director" appears, you'd strike and somebody can correct me on the pronunciation, and you put "obersturmbannfeuhrer". Wherever you have "the directors of the agencies" you would strike and put "each obersturmbannfeueher". The term "Policy Cabinet" would be stricken and in it's place would put "Schutzstaffel". What we are dealing with here, in my opinion, is a bureaucratic nightmare, a monstrosity. The Schutzstaffel, known as the SS, some people thought of as an elite corp, who were going to be special guards for Hitler and they carried out other activities. Sometimes they would be armed, they always got the best arms, were first armed and treated better than the ordinary troops, and they would fight in battles. They were most notorious for running the concentration camps and especially the death camp. People who were official in this organization had an attitude
