But we know, in this case, who is being groomed for the job. We know why he was brought here in the first place. For this purpose came he into state government, and the rest of you can sit there and get an expression on your face as though you're shocked at what I'm saying, but you know there is truth in every word of it, and some of you wish that you could stand and speak on these issues as I do. So the question of truth is not at issue. Whether it's appropriate for me to speak in this way at this time might be at issue, but what will happen when you create a larger bureaucracy is that more things and people will be lost within it. You won't be able to track down anything. You're going to find duplication. You're going to find overlapping. You're going to find favoritism, and you're going to find harassment. You're giving the Governor 23 positions that in more honest times would be referred to as patronage. Patronage is a means by which a successful politician pays off those who helped him or her get elected. Those patronage jobs are not
