

Crosby will put her hands on her hips and she'd say, and when I do that, that means I ain't coming. And the Governor will say, well, okay, if that's how you feel, and wrings his little hands, and then runs to the Legislature and says, will you take the bullwhip to my disobedient underlings because I can't control them. But by the way, while you are doing that, I want you to send me to Washington. Now if these agencies are so out of control and he cannot handle them, one is a lynx rufous, one is a lynx canadensis, and he can't handle...these are little wildcats, one is a red lynx and one is a Canadian lynx, he can't handle them, then he wants us to turn loose on him a saber-toothed tiger. This, that we are creating, is bigger than what's there right now that he can't control and govern. And that's what we're supposed to do. Not I. I have to make it clear what my position is. Why is the Legislature in such haste to do this thing which nobody on the floor completely understands? Why when Senator Wesely tries to defend Mr. Leuenberger, his friend, can he not tell me or show me anything in the bill that will prevent a repetition of the things that I've talked about? You don't change the conduct of a wrongdoer by moving him from office A...

PRESIDENT ROBAK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...to office B, and the organizational structure is not going to make that much difference if you put it under Nazis. You've got to change the makeup of the people who are in these positions, and if you can't change their character, you have to change their conduct, and there's nothing to modify conduct so quickly as saying, if you don't do your job, you are out of here, and that's what the Governor could do, but he's afraid to do it. So the Legislature is rolling over, and I don't care how few are in this Chamber, I am talking to the public now who watches us, and it will make them ask some questions. They will wonder whether what I'm saying is true or not, and some of his enemies, I am sure, will pick up on it, and ask why the Governor should be expected to go to Washington and participate in running the national government when he can't take care of this little corner of his administration. And what kind of Legislature is it that will give up (inaudible) policy without a fight in the way that's being done...
