

soldiers behind the lines who have these maps and see groups of men represented by pins on a map, and they say, well, what would happen if we put this pin from here over there? On the map, nothing, but if you make the men in the field move on the field in the same way you move that tack, you're going to lose an entire division, and the general will say, well, what the heck, we're experimenting now, let's do it. And all these men on the front lines know to do is obey when they are told to do it, and they get wiped out, and they think people are back here making decisions who care about them, who are concerned about them, who worry because these men, and now women, have families, have friends, who are concerned, who are thinking about them as courageously out there fighting for principles, the nature of which they may not know and understand for sure, but their country...

PRESIDENT ROBAK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...knows, and they are being handled in this careless, thoughtless, inhumane manner. That's what's going to happen to the recipients of these services under what this bill envisions. Not one word is contained in here to ensure that the people who are to receive these services will receive them in a better way. I am going to take a vote on my amendment, and even some who may be sympathetic to what I'm saying, would not dare put a green light on this, because let me tell you in advance, you would be totally misunderstood, and I would advise against your doing it. But I'm going to put my green there, and I hope that from my words I've made it crystal-clear where I stand on this bill. Madam President, just to maintain the air of suspense, I'll ask for a roll call vote.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. The question before the body is the adoption of the Chambers amendment to LB 1044. Senator Chambers has requested a roll call vote. Mr. Clerk, please proceed.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 1041-42 of the Legislative Journal.) 2 ayes, 39 nays on the amendment.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Chambers amendment fails. I raise the call. Mr. Clerk.
