individuals looking for new positions. They can be transferred into this. I'd like to ask Senator Stuhr a question.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Stuhr.

SENATOR STUHR: Yes.

SENATOR AVERY: Is it your intent that this could be filled, or do you have any comments, with existing staff?

SENATOR STUHR: Yes, I would hope that it could. I would think that by combining of the different agencies, that there certainly would be at least one person that might be able to accept this position and its responsibility without creating a new position.

SENATOR AVERY: And it...thank you, and I believe, and that's the one reason I am supporting this, and from looking at the number of positions that are vacant, open in the Department of Social Services, it runs continuous, on a monthly basis, of a hundred, and all the positions of administrative levels, there is at least 30 or 40 on any given month. So I believe that it is very important, I think it is something that can be done in-house and we don't have to create new positions, and it will probably be more evident as the process goes on when you combine agencies, and you pull this together. With that, I stand in support of this amendment. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Avery. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, members of the Legislature, I would like to ask Senator Wesely a question.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Wesely.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If he's here. Senator Wesely, and I'm not going to be voting for Senator Stuhr's amendment, but let's say that calls are made and people are asking questions about what is being done here, and they are aware of turf fights that exist, and the question would be asked; since you are still going to have three departments, if turf fights do develop, who is going to resolve them?

SENATOR WESELY: Okay, the way it is set up is you have the
