And I guess somewhat how I envision this, and I know that your policy secretary is going to be able to maybe act as a mediator here, but if you have three agencies out there that are designing programs, and you have a pot of money over here that nobody has, and developing the system that we need here to be able to access those funds, isn't some of what's going to happen is, boys, you sit down here and you decide who's going to get what, because nobody is going to get anything until we get the plan?
