

SENATOR HILLMAN: What I had said, a little bit is, looking at turf battles on a local level, because they don't just happen on a state level,...

SENATOR WESELY: Oh, yeah.

SENATOR HILLMAN: ...what I envision somewhat of the plan being is that with...when you have out to the "side", you have a delivery system that's developed, you have money, and you have rules and regs, and then you have the evaluation. And then you have the providers, the providers are the agencies.

SENATOR WESELY: Right.

SENATOR HILLMAN: So, for them to say, okay, this delivery system and this money, and so forth, this is the plan. And if those three agencies or those involved agencies don't work through a plan, nobody gets the money.

SENATOR WESELY: Right.

SENATOR HILLMAN: It's not necessarily always the policy director who says what's going to happen, he says to the agencies, figure it out, boys. And then when you figure out how you're going to divide this up and who's going to do the services, then we fund it. So, basically, the responsibility is on those agencies, and it's not for us to tell them how to do it, it's how are this mix going to do it,...

SENATOR WESELY: Right.

SENATOR HILLMAN: ...rather in separate areas you're going to decide how to do it collectively.

SENATOR WESELY: Yeah, that's exactly right, that's exactly right.
